NOTES FROM THE VESTRY MEETING 2 JUNE 2020

Finance

Stephen Hamilton, our Treasurer reported that the month was very unusual in terms of both revenue and expenditure due to being the first full month affected by the Covid 19 situation. However, there was a small positive net cash flow, and there are some positive indications re the impacts in May, including a small 'catch up' in envelope giving which was disrupted by the closure of the church for regular services. Any parishioners who wish to contribute to the 'catch up' in their giving, please do so, as we have projects and initiatives we wish to undertake, but which are 'on hold' until our financial position is stabilised and our future outlook for offertory giving is clearer.

Coping with Covid

The Vestry members felt that on the whole given the difficult circumstances the St. Andrew's community coped well with the situation. Telephone trees, Zoom services, Zoom coffee group meetings all helped the feeling of being in it together, and some very positive comments have been received by vestry members about the communication throughout the Level 4 and Level 3 lockdown, and also many church members greatly appreciated the organisation that went into our first service in the church for several weeks.

Health and Safety

Gordon Attwood, our health and safety champion, is bringing the Vestry up to date with their responsibilities connected with the requirements of the Health and Safety Act. The process of incident reporting will be clarified, and also the reporting of possible hazards. First Aid equipment will be checked over and items replaced if necessary.

Space for you and your baby

Preparations for this group to start in Term 3 are well under way. Maddy Langley is the co-ordinator and an oversight group of St. Andrew's parishioners has also been set up.

Music and Choir

The choir will be getting back together in Level 1 and a full programme is planned for the rest of the year. The Junior Choir will also be starting up.
