This Choral Evensong Order of Service comes from the Book of Common Prayer. It has been in use for well over 400 years, in Cathedrals, Parish Churches, and Collegiate Chapels. As these places of worship lay empty across the world during the COVID-19 global pandemic, we began to gather in a new way, to proclaim the wonderful works of God in history, and in the life and death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We do so again tonight to offer our praise, penitence, and prayer to God. Tonight's service incorporates recorded video from both St Andrew's Choir, and Holy Trinity Cathedral, Mary's Singers (by agreement with Anita Banbury (Director) and the Dean, Precentor and Music Team at Holy Trinity Cathedral). It includes the inaugural performance (recorded on the 3rd Sunday after Epiphany, 2020) of a new setting of the Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis composed by Elizabeth Salmon, a former assistant organist and member of the choir of Holy Trinity Cathedral under the late Prof. Peter Godfrey (1922-2017). Members of the congregation will be muted throughout the service. You are invited to join in the words in bold and hymns from home.
