

LET THE WORD OF CHRIST DWELL IN YOU RICHLY

We say these words from Paul's letter to the Colossian regularly in our worship. But what does it really mean to let the word of Christ dwell within us? Mediation on the scriptures, daily bible readings, memorizing and singing the psalms, or scriptural songs, reciting a text while you take a prayer walk, and studying the bible are all ways we can invite the scripture into our hearts and into our lives. Another way is to use the devotional reading process of *LECTIO DIVINA*, sometimes known as the African Bible Study method. It has five stages:

- * Silencio: Put yourself in the presence of God. Become quiet and offer yourself to God.
- * Lectio. Read the text aloud, slowly allowing the words to resonate and settle in your heart. Linger on the word or phrase that catches your attention and lights up for you. Sit with the word or phrase and savor it as a word of God for you.
- * Meditatio: Read the passage again and listen to where the word connects with your life right now. Enter into the scene in your imagination. Imagination is a god given gift. Envision the scene. Carefully watch the scene. Listen to how people and the environment interact. What do you hear and experience as you watch and listen.?
- * Oratio: Read the passage one more time, listening attentively. Has God addressed you in this word and invited you to respond? Allow the scripture to lead you into a prayer response. Do not censure your throughs or requests. Let them flow out spontaneously and freely before the God who loves you. Hold nothing back. Respond to God's invitation to you.
- * Contemplatio: Deeply receive God's Word and rest in his presence and love. Give yourself some time to wait and be still before you reenter life as usual. Take God's word to you with you throughout the day. Return to it and remember it all day long. Stay with God until you feel

Waikumete Cemetery 1918 Pandemic Monument This is a very topical pilgrimage. It is not intended as a celebration or any sort of thanksgiving for surviving the present pandemic. We still have some way to go on that front. Rather it is an exercise in mindfulness and being aware of the serious situation the world is in. We walk from St George's to St Andrew's Epsom to look at their interesting 1918 plaque. From there we largely follow the course of Oakley Creek from Hillsborough to Avondale.
